## **TO THE CITIZENS OF ABINGTON TOWNSHIP:**

I wish to briefly point out the things which may be of special interest in the work of the past year.

### **New Committees**

To keep pace with the needs of this fast growing community, the Board must constantly take up new activities. For this reason, three new committees have been formed—Parks and Planning, Sewers and Zoning—as will be seen on the first page.

### **Snow Removal**

In January 1926 a Ford tractor, with caterpillar equipment and snow plow, was purchased to open the roads during heavy snow falls. It has done quite effective work.

### **County and State Assistance**

Edge Hill Road, east of York Road, was regraded and a concrete pavement laid, 16 feet wide. This was done wholly at the expense of the State Highway Department and the County. The same work was also done on Mt. Carmel Avenue from Roberts Avenue to the Upper Dublin Township Line in North Glenside; the County further contributed \$5,000 towards rebuilding Welsh Road.

### **New Construction**

Welsh Road was rebuilt from Edge Hill Road to York Road. A penetration macadam top was put on Washington Lane between Meadowbrook and Valley Roads; on Wharton Avenue from Geneva Avenue to Jenkintown Road; on Geneva Avenue from Easton Road to Sylvania Avenue; this work had been started in 1925. The same was done on Bradfield Road from Susquehanna Road to Easton Road; and penetration macadam was put down between new gutter paving and old macadam on Roberts Avenue from Geneva Avenue to Jenkintown Road.

Jenkintown Road, in Switchville, has always been in bad repair on account of poor drainage and flat grades. An opportunity presented itself to remedy this condition when the large property owners put down curbing and gutter paving at their own expense. The Township extended the surface water drain, constructed two new inlets and laid a new penetration macadam surface; a part of Jenkintown Road in Weldon was also re-surfaced.

To improve the drainage conditions and make it possible for property owners to put down sidewalks, grades were established on Arnold Avenue, LaMott and Rubicam Avenues, northwest of Easton Road, Crestmont, more than four blocks were graded to

the new grades, and to make the roadbed more serviceable until property owners will put down permanent paving, a new coat of cinders was spread.

### **General Highway Work**

In addition to removing ashes and keeping up the general maintenance of the Highways, which is now going on nearly all the time, the following work was done:

Two coat surface treatment was put down on Maple Avenue from Limekiln Turnpike to Spruce Street, and on Brooke Road from York Road to Huntingdon Road. New stone surface was put on Welsh Road from Highland Avenue to Fitzwatertown Road and on Hamilton Avenue from Easton Road to Crestmont Avenue.

One coat surface treatment was put on Grove, Upland, Spring, Runnymede, Cheltona, Cloverly and Spruce Avenues in the Noble District; on Cedar Road from McCullough's entrance to Second Street Pike; on Fox Chase Road from Cedar Road to Second Street Pike; Geneva Avenue from Sylvania Avenue to Tyson Avenue; on Cherry Lane, and on Prospect Road.

Curb was set by property owners on Cricket Avenue, North Glenside, above Limekiln Turnpike, to the new grade as fixed by the State Highway Department, and the street filled in ready for gutter paving and macadamizing.

### **Setback Ordinance**

Property owners in erecting stores at Ogontz Avenue and Township Line, McKinley; Woodland and Easton Roads, Roslyn; and south side of Jenkintown Road west of Tyson Avenue, Ardsley, have, without any objection on their part, complied with the "setback ordinance." The wisdom of passing the ordinance is therefore already justified.

### **Parks and Playgrounds**

During the past year the purchase of additional ground at Weldon was effected and more lots were also secured next to the playground adjoining the North Glenside School. The School Board has very generously offered to improve this playground.

This work is now in progress. Additional funds are available for acquiring ground in other sections.

Quite a number of our citizens, during the past year, have suggested that steps be taken to establish parks along the Penny-pack Creek and along Highland Road.

### Plumbing

The Plumbing Inspector reports that 10 examinations were given and 32 plumbers were registered as Master Plumbers. Sixty-two Master Plumbers re-registered in December for the year 1927. 407 plans were submitted, approved and permits issued.

### New Township Buildings

On June 1st, 1926, all the Township offices were moved to the new building erected at Horace Avenue and York Road. The capital expenditures were less than \$56,000, in addition to the old grounds and buildings. The Police Department for the first time has adequate quarters, and the rest of the building is admirably arranged to transact the Township business. Most favorable comments have been made by all who have seen the new buildings.

The Highway Department did all the grading, laying of drives and walks around the new building. This work was paid for out of the building fund and is included in the figures given.

and has been accepted as a part of said Board. Nine licenses have been issued to Retail Milk Dealers in our Township.

#### **House Sewers**

The Sewer Committee is now actively engaged in the preparation of plans for sewerage that part of the Township which lies on the Tacony Creek water shed. The plans will be presented to the State Department of Health during the early part of 1927.

#### **Traffic Control**

To provide for better traffic control on Easton Road and York Road, the Police Department expects, early in 1927, to patrol both these Roads by men on motorcycles.
