



Your Directors of Public Affairs submit the following matters for your consideration.

During the year we have provided office space in the basement for the National Youth Administration, National Re-employment Service and State Relief.

The functional organization of the Township is exhibited in detail on page four.

The 1938 Tax Anticipation Note of \$100,000. was sold February 15, 1938 to Fischer, MacEwan & Company, 1500 Walnut Street, Philadelphia at an interest cost of .0074. This Note was paid October fifteenth out of the 1938 current taxes and the Township has no temporary loan obligations.



The following speed limit zones were established and proper signs erected:


1. Edge Hill Road from Easton Road, Roslyn, to Tyson Avenue, Ardsley.





DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

Bureau of Fire Protection

Abington Township has a Class "B" rating fire zone. This rating has been brought about by the improved equipment and the efficient service rendered by the five volunteer fire companies composing the Abington Township Fire Board.


The seven pumpers totaling 3600 gallons per minute rated capacity are fully equipped for hydrant or draft operation. All pumpers in service have been tested and found in satisfactory condition. Incipient fire equipment, booster service, tool equipment and pumping capacity are generally satisfactory. The ladder truck is of proper type, well equipped and in good condition. Hose supply is satisfactory.

Telephone alarms are received at the Police switchboard where continued service is maintained, and the handling of telephone alarms has been developed to a highly effectual degree.

There are approximately 250 fire hydrants located throughout the township, properly maintained and kept in good condition. Tests in the mercantile areas show the hydrant pressure from 50 to 112 pounds and elsewhere a range of 50 to 127 pounds, averaging 82 pounds. The local Building and Zoning Ordinances are of considerable value in producing fire resistive construction materials.

There were many complaints lodged with the Fire Board by the members of the Volunteer Fire Companies regarding the grass and field fire alarms, many of which proved futile. Members serving in a volunteer fire company, in order to answer an alarm, are required to leave their daily vocation and appear upon the scene of the fire. It is also a great expense to the fire company to run its fire truck on irresponsible calls. Field fires are mostly caused through negligence and the Fire Board have been requested to consider adopting rules and regulations governing and controlling such fires and imposing a penalty on the person responsible for these futile fires in an amount equal to the expense caused a company and its members in attending a fire.

The Commissioners and Fire Board solicit the sincere cooperation of everyone in minimizing grass and field fires.


Zoning

The Zoning Board of Adjustment is created to take care of special cases where relief can be given without violating the intent of the Zoning Ordinance. Our Building Inspector is the Administrative Officer and is charged with administering the law as stated in the Township Ordinance.

The Zoning Board of Adjustment during the year received seven applications for a Variance and Special Exception. Public hearings were held in each instance and four of these applications, owing to special condition not being contrary to the public interest, were granted and three were refused.

When an Appeal is made to the Zoning Board of Adjustment merely for the allowance of a use in a zoning district where that use is prohibited, the Zoning Board refer the Appeal to the governing body or Board of Commissioners who under the terms of the Zoning Ordinance, consider the advisability of the change of district.

The Board of Commissioners received during the year eleven Petitions for Change of Classification in the Abington Township Zoning Ordinance of 1936, public hearings in each instance were held resulting in two Appeals being withdrawn, three refused and six granted, the Ordinance being amended accordingly.

The Health Officer received sixty-one (61) complaints of overflowing cesspool nuisance and directed the owners to abate the same.

The Health Officer inspected one hundred and seventy-one (171) public eating places, drinking places and soda fountains within our Township and issued six hundred and twenty-five (625) Health Certificates to the employers and employees. This report was filed with the State Department of Restaurant Hygiene.

The Plumbing Inspector investigated twelve (12) violations and nuisance complaints and supervised their correction.

Four summons were issued for violations of the Health and Plumbing Ordinances, hearings held before the Justice of Peace, and fines imposed.

The Plumbing Inspector reported three hundred and thirty-four plans of plumbing work were approved and permits issued during the year 1938. Certificates of Registration were issued during the year to forty-eight (48) Master Plumbers, eighty-two (82) Transient Master Plumbers and nineteen Journeyman Plumbers.

Two (2) septic tank tile field combinations, ninety-four (94) leaching cesspools and nine (9) sub-soil drainage systems were installed under the supervision of the Plumbing Inspector.

Sixteen (16) applications for connections to the Township Sewer System were filed with the Plumbing Inspector. The laterals were laid by the employees of the Department of Public Works.

The Bureau of Health received three hundred and eighty-two requests for garbage service during the year, which were given immediate attention by the contractor William B. Simons, Jr., Almont, Pa.

The Milk Inspection of our Township were supervised by the Old York Road Milk Control Board. The Township's share in the expense of inspection was \$522.07 and for the analysis of milk and cream \$460.72.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH

Bureau of Sanitary Sewers

A 370 ft. extension of 8" vitrified pipe Sanitary Sewer was placed in Highland Avenue approximately 100 feet north of Horace avenue, Ward 1.

The Abington Township Sewer Authority in 1937 referred back to the Board of Commissioners the matter of constructing, improving, maintaining and operating a sanitary sewer system for Abington Township and the Commissioners, by resolution, directed that all matters and things relating to the proposed constructions and operation of a sanitary sewer system for Abington Township, be referred to the Department of Health for investigation and recommendation.

During the year the Department of Health acting as a sewer committee was augmented by the members of the Department of Public Works. This special sewer committee considered and studied methods of financing the proposed sewer system. The Board directed the Secretary to file an application with the Federal Administration of Public Works for a grant to aid in financing the construction of our comprehensive sanitary sewer system and disposal plant. This application was required to have been filed not later than September 30 and actual work on the sewer system must have been contracted for and under construction on or before December 31, 1938 otherwise the terms stipulated in the application would be rendered void.

The special sewer committee reported to the Board of Commissioners, at their annual meeting January 3, 1939, they had made a further study of the comprehensive sanitary sewer system approved May 23, 1938 and had supplied each Commissioner with an adjusted financial statement of receipts and expenditures. That in the study they recommend the exclusion of the acquisition of the Cheltenham and Abington Sewerage System Company and they further recommend that bonds under the councilmanic authority be issued to aid in the financing in the expense of construction of the treatment works and the Sandy Run Interceptor. The Commissioners adopted the following resolution:

"That the Abington Township Comprehensive Sanitary Sewer Plan, approved May 23, 1938, be amended to exclude the acquisition of the existing Cheltenham and Abington Sanitary Sewerage Company system and the adjusted estimate of receipts and expenditures be approved for testing and judicially determining the legality of resolutions, ordinances, agreements and indentures adopted, enacted and executed pursuant to the Act of July 18, 1935 P. L. 1286 as amended by the Act of May 14, 1937 P. L. 630 and of Article XXIV of the Act of June 24, 1931 P. L. 1206, as amended by the Act of May 7, 1937 P. L. 574."

It is expected the constitutionality of the non-debt revenue bond act will be judicially determined during the year 1939.

The Department treated with dust laying material, various unimproved streets throughout the Township, totalling approximately seven miles.

Refuse & Ash Collection

During the year 1938 a summer and winter collection schedule of refuse and ashes was adopted by the Department. Weekly collections were made according to the Winter schedule and bi-weekly collections according to the Summer schedule.

A total of 1650 truck loads of refuse and ashes were collected. The ashes were placed on unimproved streets in various wards of the Township. The refuse was deposited on the dump.

Miscellaneous

Miscellaneous work performed by the Department.

Cooperated with the Department of Public Safety by erecting speed limit signs along Jenkintown Road, Wards 3 and 9: Jenkintown Road, Ward 4: and Edge Hill Road Wards 8 and 9.

Cooperated with the Department of Health by installing nine new Sanitary Sewer House Laterals, in Wards 1, 7 and 12.

Removed 2 antiquated inlets and 30 feet of broken pipe then rebuilt the intersection at Grove Avenue and Center Avenue, Noble, Ward 7.

Removed an antiquated storm drain and constructed the intersection to a larger radius at the intersection of Meadowbrook Road and Huntingdon Road, Ward 1.

After additional ground was acquired from the abutting property owners at the northeast corner of Edge Hill Road and Ferndale Avenue the Department placed curb, gutter and sidewalk and macadam paving to an enlarged radius, Ward 10.

General Public Works Department Work

The Department forces performed routine work in connection with the maintenance of roads, sewers and parks, this work embraces the following:

Patching holes in streets and repairing street openings made by Utility Companies.

Cleaning streets and gutters, storm water sewers, inlets, drainage ditches and water courses.

Maintenance and inspection of the Sanitary Sewers, flume and meter pit.

Scraping and maintaining unimproved streets.

Cutting grass, weeds and underbrush and trimming trees for proper clearance for pedestrians and vehicles.

Snow fence erection and removal.

Snow plowing and snow removal.

Cindering icy hills and street intersections.

Painting guard rails along Highways.

Painting street name signs and sign posts.

Park and playground and police pistol range maintenance.

REAL ESTATE REGISTRY BUREAU

The Board of Commissioners enacted Ordinance No. 409 establishing a Registry of Ownership of all Real Estate in the Township of Abington. All persons acquiring title to real estate in Abington Township, whether by purchase, devise, partition or in any other manner whatsoever, shall furnish to the Township Engineer, at his office, in the Township Building, descriptions of their respective properties upon blanks furnished by the Township, and, at the same time, present their conveyance to be stamped by said Engineer, without charge, as evidence of the registry thereof.

The Prothonotary and Recorder of Deeds of Montgomery County, under the provisions of the Act of Assembly, shall not admit for record any deed to any property in Abington Township unless same shall first have been duly stamped, as hereinbefore provided.

Parks & Playgrounds

Settlement was made with W. Clyde Gourley, Inc. for approximately 6½ acres of land bounded by Harding, Cleveland and Corinthian Avenues, Overlook Hills, Ward 10.

Mrs. J. Smylie Herkness and Messers Wayne and Malcolm Herkness offered and presented to the Township a 17 acre tract of land fronting Valley Road in Saw Mill Hill Ward No. 2, to be known as the Abington Township Bird Sanctuary, and to be used for the preservation of bird and wild animal life native to Pennsylvania. It is expected the Commissioners will formally accept this sanctuary in the early part of 1939.
